
#### **BPW Reimagined Survey**

#### We are still in need of a nomination for the office of Vice-President.

#### The Vice President shall:

- a. Submit copies of all recommendations received from Regions to Executive Committee members.
- b. Receive periodic reports from Region Presidents and compile an Annual Report as directed by the President.
- c. Work with the President-elect to prepare the Board Training Manual and other materials for use at the State Leadership School. The Board Training Manual requires the approval of the Executive Committee.
- d. Assist the President-elect with the development of the Agenda for the State Leadership School and participate in the school as requested by the President-elect.
- e. Preside at all meetings of the Region Presidents.
- f. Serve as a member of the Ohio Business and Professional Women's Retirement Foundation.

## **Friday Business Meeting**

My name is Chelsea Clark and I'm a small business owner, a city councilwoman, a sixth generation farmer, and a single mom. I grew up in Allen County and graduated from Elida High School. I went to Miami University where I studied business, started the campus chapter of the ACLU, and helped to organize for better wages for university employees.



After graduation, I began my career in Cincinnati as a financial analyst before becoming a teacher. In my spare time, I started a non-profit geared toward providing services to Cincinnati-area parents helping their children learn math and science. I also became a caregiver for my sister and raised our children, as my husband served multiple deployments in the military.

In 2017, I was elected to Forest Park City Council, a city in North Hamilton County which has a majority of black and immigrant population. It is there that I have led our minority business outreach program, bringing scores of jobs to our city while also connecting business owners and entrepreneurs to the tools they need to get ahead.

That same year, I started the STEM Lab, in Blue Ash, a full-service organization for kids of all ages to help provide opportunities to learn about science, technology, engineering, and math to underserved families. We develop students' problem-solving and critical thinking skills and prepare kids ages 2-14 for the jobs of tomorrow.

As a mom, elected official, and entrepreneur, I know how important it is that we have leaders who know what it takes to balance complex issues, put people ahead of politics, and create an equal playing field for the future.

"VICTORIA CANNING WOODHULL"

Speaker: Anne McEvoy, Portrayer of Historical Women

In 1872, nearly fifty years before women in this country finally won their right to vote, one young suffragist distinguished herself by becoming the first female to have her name officially on the ballot as a candidate for president of the United States.

Her name was Victoria Canning Woodhull, and at 34 years of age....not even old enough for the constitutionally mandated age of 35 for presidential candidates...she had already gained nation-



al attention and the support of suffrage luminaries Susan B. Anthony and Elizabeth Cady Stanton. And with good reason. Victoria not only helped to promote the most urgent issues addressed by the women's movement...property rights, marriage rights, educational and professional equality...she had also become the editor of a radical weekly newspaper, the first woman to address a Congressional committee, and the first ever female stockbroker on Wall Street. With only 3 years of formal education and a prickly family history colored by abuse, scandal, spiritualism, and outrageous characters, Victoria's story is both compelling and complicated. It's the story of woman who was not only well-ahead of her time, but unapologetically herself. And as most would agree, it's a story well-worth the telling.
