Susan B. Anthony, 1820-1906 Alice Paul, 1885-1977 Elizabeth Cady Stanton, 1815-1902 Lucy Stone, 1818-1893 Ida B. Wells, 1862- 1931

These five ladies fought for years for women to get the right to vote.

Susan B Anthony, was born to Quaker parents



in the northwestern corner of Massachusetts. She was raised to be independent and outspoken. Her parents like many Quakers, believed that men and women

should study, live and work as equals and commit themselves equally to the eradication of cruelty and injustice in the world. Anthony was a temperance activist in Rochester, New York, where she taught at a girls' school. She was taken seriously by few politicians because she thought alcohol was a sin and was advocating on behalf of a "women's issue." Women needed the vote, she concluded, so they could assure the government kept women's interests in mind. Anthony was the second president of the National American Woman Suffrage Association (NAWSA). She continued to fight for the vote until she died on March 13, 1906.

Alice Paul was the leader of the most militant wing of the woman suffrage movement. Born in 1885 to a wealthy Quaker family in New Jersey, Paul was well educated. She earned an undergraduate degree in biology from Swarthmore College and a PhD in sociology from the University of Pennsylvania and was determined to win the vote by any means necessary. Spending time in London with Emmeline Pankhurst, while in graduate school, she learned how to use civil disobedience and other unladylike tactics to draw attention to her cause. In 1910, Paul brought those militant tactics to the well-established NAWSA.

These women fought for women's rights. This is only part of their incredible stories. Anthony, Paul, Stanton, Stone and Wells were just a few of the women that gave so much for us to have the right to vote today.

My question for everyone to think about is: Where would we be today if these great ladies hadn't been committed to their cause and fought for our rights? They went to prison, picketed the White House, went on hunger strikes and so much more.

Here we are today, BPW is 100 years old. What would happen if we disappear? How can we increase and retain our membership?

Let's build this great organization up again, share our ideas on getting new members, tell our stories, support each other and increase our ranks! There is strength in numbers and we have 100 years worth of action, supporting each other and progressing women's rights. We are stronger together— We'll see you at Conference!

To make changes to this platform:

- 1. Each Region has an elected Legislative Representative that meets with the other regional representatives in April of each year to review, discuss, and possibly change the platform. Any recommendations are funneled through them from their respective local organizations.
- 2. The resulting platform is then presented to the board for approval.
- 3. Board approved by-laws are presented to the entire annual conference body.
- 4. At conference, if approved, the platform is established until the next year's conference.

Katherine Durack, PhD, Raconteur, shares how Ohio women played an early significant role in fighting for the right to vote. Durack's program is called "Suffrage In Stitches" and covers the Women's Fight For Political Voice.

She is the author of a series of podcasts with different topics such as women gaining the right to obtain library cards in 1877. Before that year single women could not check out books because they were not married. Married women had to use their husband's library card.

In 1903 the National American Women's Suffrage Association was headquartered in Warren, Ohio until 1910.


