

Busy Time for Legislation

Let's start with the August election. Ohio voters voted NO to unnecessary changes to the process to amend our Ohio Constitution. Good job voters!



Speaking of Constitutions, The Equal Rights Amendment is STILL being discussed in Washington D.C. At a "Coffee with the Congressman" sponsored by the Coshocton Chamber of Commerce, Congressman Troy Balderson (R 12th District) spoke on many topics. When asked about the ERA he indicated he was aware of the efforts both in the House and Senate but does not think there will be serious movement on the publication of the ERA until next year. September is Legislation Month for BPW so don't forget to read the BPW/OH Website to get some information on Constitution Day. We are going to have a virtual meeting Sunday, September 17 and write some letters to our federal and state representatives. OR, if you'd rather, do this as a meeting with your local. What do we have to say? Well, for one Frank LaRose and his cronies are trying to change the ballot language on the Reproductive Rights Amendment.



"In a 3-2 split decision Thursday, the Ohio Ballot Board rejected using the full text of a proposed reproductive rights amendment on the ballot in November, adopting instead summary language written by the Ohio Secretary of State's Office that was criticized for being incomplete and inaccurate.

The board's approval of the language – which is now titled Issue 1 for the November general election – was the next step in the process of voters deciding whether or not the Ohio Constitution will include the right to abortion, as well as contraception, fertility treatment, miscarriage care, and continuing one's own pregnancy. Those last four items were all left out of the language approved by the ballot board majority." Ohio Capital Journal.com

This is a blatant attempt to confuse the voters, similar to what they tried to pull on August 8. PLEASE, discuss this Amendment with your friends, family and anyone else who will listen. This is NOT just about abortion.

This class is a chance for BPW members to receive personalized coaching in a supportive environment on how to be a more efficient and effective businessperson. Students have the opportunity to deep-dive in to a variety of topics:

Leadership. Learn more about your leadership style, developing leadership skills, and goal setting. Presentation Skills. Attendees will give a variety of speeches, executive presence, advocacy communications, and using social media.

NATIONAL BUSINESS WOMEN'S WEEK OCTOBER 15 – 21

HISTORYof NBWW

The concept of **National Business Women's Week**® originated with Emma Dot Partridge, Executive Secretary of the National Federation of Business and Professional Women's Clubs from 1924 to 1927.

The first annual observance of NBWW was held April 15-22, 1928, when National President Lena Madesin Phillips opened the week with a nationally broadcast speech. She stated that the purpose of the week was "to focus public attention upon a better business woman for a better business world.

From this early effort, NBWW has grown into a nationwide salute to all working women. The program for the first observance of NBWW included: Legislative Day devoted to national, state and local legislation of interest to women; Education Day devoted to emphasizing the need for equitable educational opportunities; Club Rally Day for prospective new members; Community Day honoring leaders in the community; and Goodwill Day devoted to working with other women's organizations.

In 1938, NBWW was moved to the third full week of October. U.S. President Herbert Hoover was the first president to issue a letter recognizing NBWW and the contributions and achievements of working women. The celebration of **National Business Women's Week®** has helped to promote leadership roles for women and to increase opportunities for their advancement.
