Legislation Chair 2019-2020, Penny Pelikan Dehner

March, just another month...or a call to action?

I write this article on **International Women's Day**, March 8th, 2020. A global day celebrating the social, economic, cultural and political achievements of women. The day also marks a call to action for accelerating women's equality. Did you doing anything special? Did you go to an event?

Tuesday March 17th is St. Patrick's Day, and the day to **VOTE** in Ohio's primary. Are you voting? Are you driv-

ing another person to the polls? Maybe you are running for office?

Equal Pay Day is Tuesday, March 31, 2020. This date symbolizes how far into the year women must work to earn what men earned in the previous year. Are you doing anything special? Are you going to an event?

Women have such opportunities. What are we doing with it? We have so much on our plates, jobs, families, home, social activities, self care...to add yet another event might feel overwhelming.

Here are a few easy ways to promote change and advancement for the equal rights of women...have your voice heard.

- Give this copy of the OBW to someone so they might see what we are doing and get involved.
- On Equal Pay Day, buy a bag of mini Payday candy bars, put a sticker on it that says His \$1.00 = Her \$0.80. It's a conversation starter. Hand them out to people you see that day or leave one where ever you go that day.
- Leave this copy of the OBW some place where another woman might read it and get involved.
- 4. Take a friend to vote.
- 5. Keep a few voter registration

forms in your purse/wallet/ brief case and give them to people that are not registered to vote.

- 6. Ask other women, are you voting this year!
- 7. Praise other women for their accomplishments, a simple text could give her the encouragement she needs.
- 8. Call your representative and tell them how you feel about an issue.

9. Donate to Buckeye Girls



State so young women can be exposed to the political process and become our future leaders.

If WE don't step up and do the small things that promote change, who will?

Who will encourage our daughters and granddaughters to continue the fight for equal rights?

I am outraged that women still earn only 80 cents for every dollar a man earns. I'm also tired, as progress is a slow moving train. It can wear us down. Maybe you are like me. I have to remind myself to persist and that small and consistent acts of awareness or encouragement can have a big impact.

I encourage each of you to plan an event for Equal Pay Day March 31, 2020. It might be something small

like passing out the Payday candy bars. It may be planning a city wide event. Just do something...you can find many ideas and resources on the web.

If we don't keep trying, history will repeat itself. Women being told what to do (not working outside the home),

how to dress (she was asking for it) and not having a voice (no right to vote).

Yes, 100 years ago women couldn't vote. That changed largely in part to strong, determined women who led the march and persisted even when they were tired, jailed, beaten down and some force fed (Alice Paul)...all so women can vote.

Voting is your RIGHT and your RE-SPONSIBILITY.

There is power in numbers. Remember that change is not just at the Presidential level but at the state, county and local levels. GO VOTE. RUN FOR OFFICE. BE THAT CHANGE!

We can help! The Individual Development course can up your game. Module 5 gives you an outline on how to present your subject and yourself.

Here are some basic tips when giving a speech:

- Know your audience—really, know who they are and what they are there to get from you.
- Know your material. Don't read from a paper or presentation, but be able to paraphrase and give additional information not on the handouts.
- Relax—take that deep breath (remember science proves that this helps—see last OBW article on stress management)
- Concentrate on the message and stay focused. Getting off track is easy.
- 5. Make eye contact with the audience. If that is uncomfortable, look at the top of their heads, they will never know your are not looking them in the eyes!
- Know that your opening and closing words are more important than all the words in between.

Yes, the gap matters.

I want to be paid equally, every woman does.

The Equal Pay Act has been law for over 50 years but policy changes are still needed if we are to reach equal pay status. The laws need updated, they need to be strengthened.

Did you know that women of all races and education levels are paid less than men? This gap could be reduced if the wages of low-income jobs were increased and women weren't taking a financial hit just for being a parent/ mother.

SO, draw awareness to the pay gap by participating in a local event on Equal Pay Day (EPD)!

EPD 2020 dates for 2020 are:

ALL WOMEN's EPD, March 31, 202 (82 cents)

Mom's EPD, June 4, 2020 (70 cents)

Black Women's EPD, August 13, 2020 (62 cents)

Native Women's EPD, October 1, 2020 (57 cents)

Latina Women's EPD, November 2, 2020 (54 cents)

On the national level, overall women make (2020 stats) \$0.82 per every dollar a man makes, but this varies by state.

In D.C., Maryland and Nevada women get 86 cents and hooray, California comes in at 88.1 cents.

If you move to Wyoming or Louisiana, well the average drops to 69 and 70 cents respectively.

2018 American Community Survey Data shows that (note that more current data is reflected above):


Asian women earn 90 cents nationally and in Ohio, 88 cents.

Caucasian women, 79 cents nationally and 77 cents in Ohio.

African American women, 62 cents nationally, 63 in Ohio.

Native American 57 nationwide and in Ohio 70.

Latinas nationwide get an average of 54 cents, Ohio 61 cents.

The Equal Rights Amendment: Still Relevant?

Many think women's equality is a settled Constitutional issue. But the Equal Rights

Amendment (ERA) had a time limit for ratification. It was 1982 and, as of that date, there were still 3 more states needed to ratify. Even though during the past few years 2 more states have ratified the amendment, women's rights are still not guaranteed by the Constitution.

Why did it fail in 1982? Why was there a time limit on the amendment in the first place? Can one put a time limit on civil rights? Hear what Supreme Court Justices Ginsberg and Scalia have to say on this subject. Can guaranteed equality be achieved without a Constitutional "umbrella"? Find out what is happening <u>right now</u> regarding this issue and how you can help make history.

Kathie McKenna Kelly found her advocacy sea legs fighting for the educational rights of disabled children. She later moved on to issues affecting women and their families. She has served as State President for Business & Professional Women/AZ (BPW/AZ) and as their Legislative Representative to Business & Professional Women/USA (BPW/USA). She held the position of Trustee on the BPW/AZ Foundation.

Kathie has served on the BPW/USA Legislative Committee and as Chair of the BPW/USA ERA Task Force on the recommendation of Merwyn Heath. She was Arizona Coordinator for the ERA Campaign Network and for United 4 Equality and is a member of Veteran Feminists of America.


